Physician/Patient Relationship

General Standards

"Physician/patient relationship" is formed when a physician either directly or indirectly interacts with a patient to diagnose, treat, or recommend treatment for any condition or illness the patient presents, regardless of whether it is recognized as a disease by the medical community. This relationship must start with a face-to-face meeting that is medically appropriate and includes taking the patient's history, performing a physical examination, and creating a plan. The relationship also requires medically indicated follow-up care when appropriate.

Telemedicine/Online Prescriptions

The requirements for establishing a physician/patient relationship remain the same even when using telemedicine. Initially, this relationship must include a scheduled face-to-face encounter that is both medically appropriate and documented. This encounter shall include a history, physical examination, and plan. A specific telehealth physical examination tool is not mandated by the Board.

The initial encounter with the provider in the physician/patient relationship must occur **BEFORE** care is provided.
