AI is...

A tool used to support learning and help with other tasks.

Already embedded in many tools you use daily (e.g., Canvas, Netflix, Google Docs)

A tool that can include inaccurate or flawed information.

A tool that should be used responsibly and ethically with clear guidelines and purpose.

AI is NOT...

A replacement for a human or human interaction. It is simply a computer program that follows pre-set instructions.

Something you can turn off and ignore. It is not going away, so we need to learn how to use and understand it.

A source of information that can be used without checking for bias and accuracy. Humans must always check content created.

A free pass to cheat or plagiarize. Academic integrity remains crucial. AI-enhanced work should be properly cited and understood.

- ➔ **AI is a tool:** Think of it as a powerful tool, like a calculator or word processor. It can help us do things more efficiently, but it is not a magic solution.
- ➔ **Humans are still important:** AI is meant to support human capabilities, not replace them. Human oversight, critical thinking, and ethical judgment are essential.
- ➔ **Education is key:** We need to educate students, teachers, and parents about AI so that everyone can use it responsibly and effectively.
