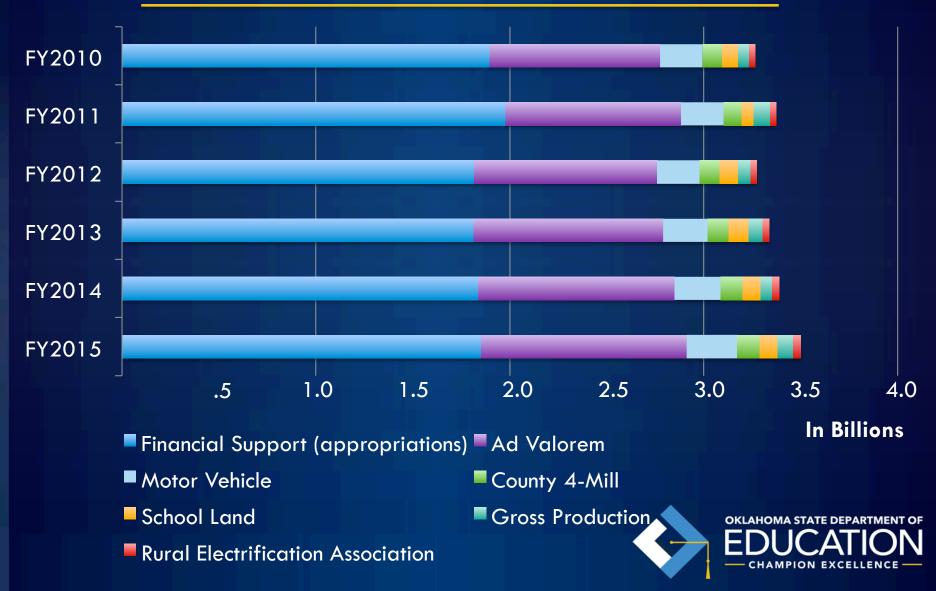

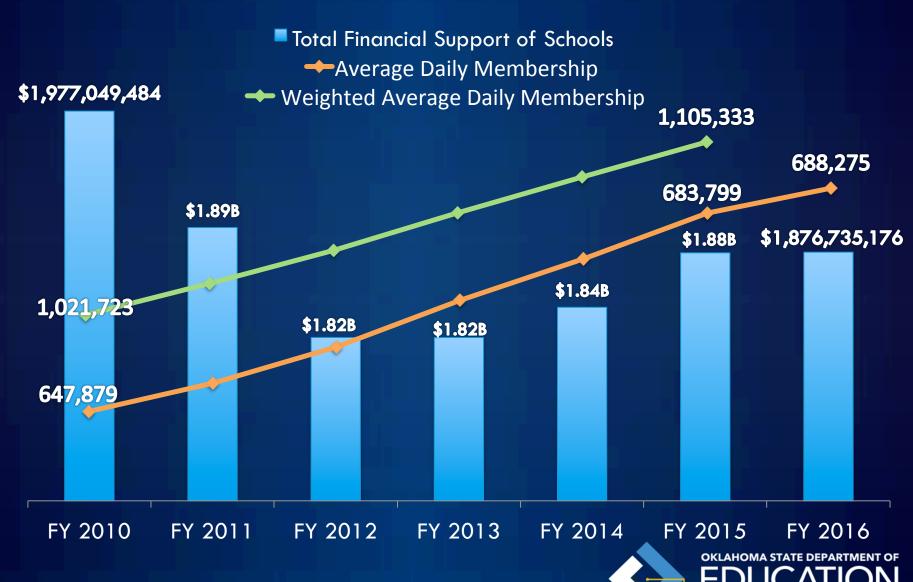

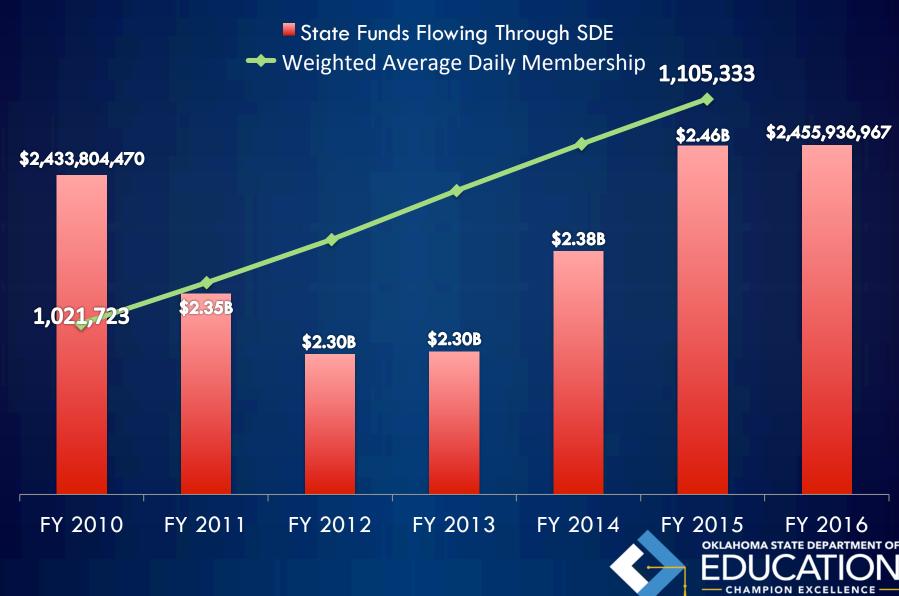

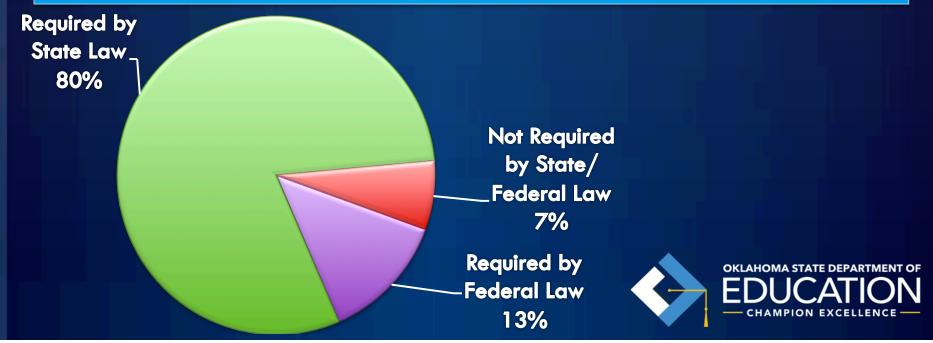

Changes in Public School Activities (Line Items)

Required by State/Federal Law

- Standards Implementation: \$500,000
 - \$436,000 more than in FY16
- Teacher and Leader Effectiveness: \$2,500,000
 - \$1,500,000 more than in FY16
- Teacher Residency Program: \$1,000,000
 - \$750,000 more than in FY16

Not Required by State/Federal Law

- SCORE Grants: No funding, program completed
 - \$189,000 less than in FY16
- School Competitive Grants Pool: \$4,061,636
 - \$2,000,658 less than in FY16



ELA/Math Standards Implementation

- Request: \$500,000
- Implementation of new standards once approved:
 - Transition teams
 - develop recommendations for supporting districts/teachers for PD and curriculum frameworks
 - Regional Summits
 - bring teachers together to provide options on how to implement standards in classrooms
 - PD on Your Plan

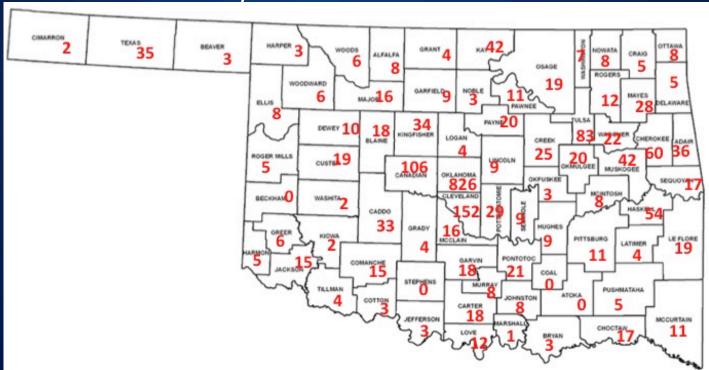

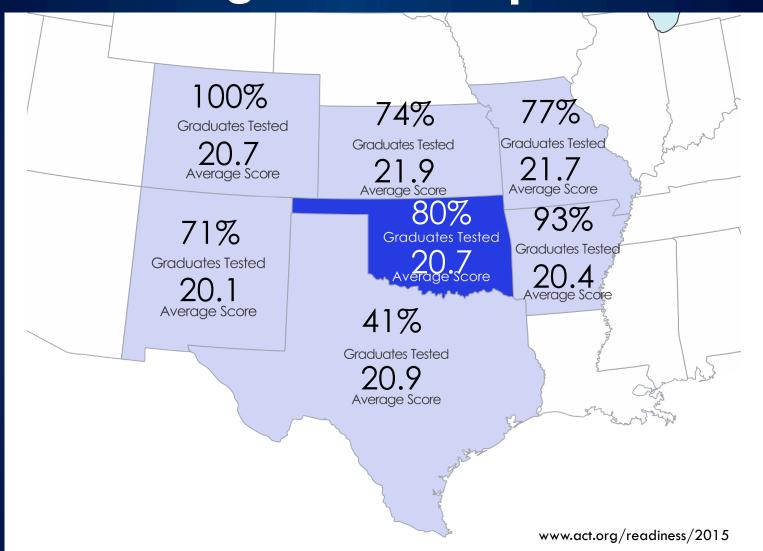

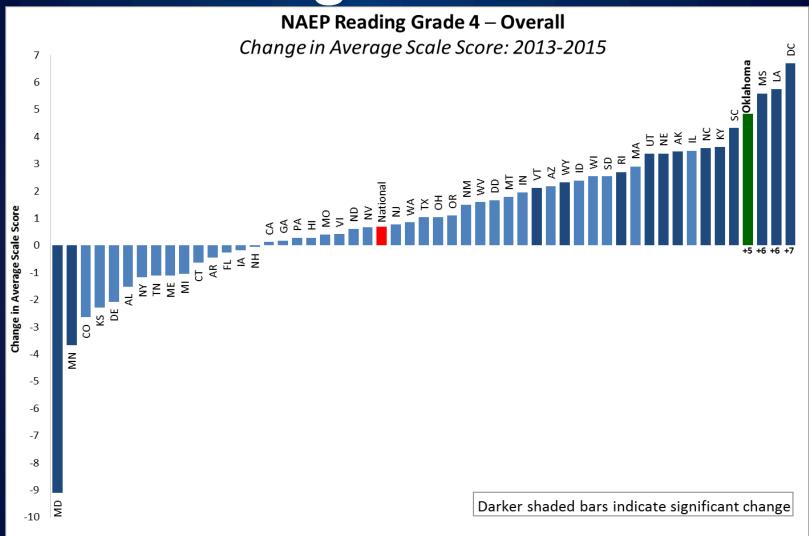

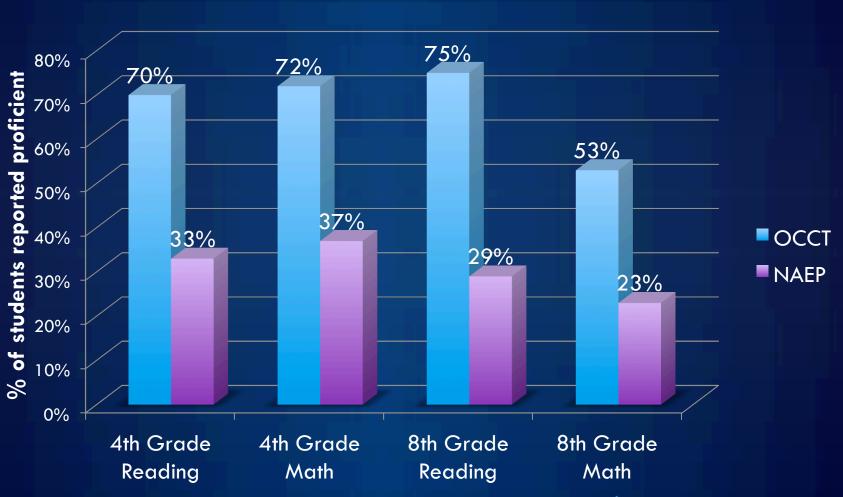

Proficient vs. Prepared 8th Grade Math, 2012-2013

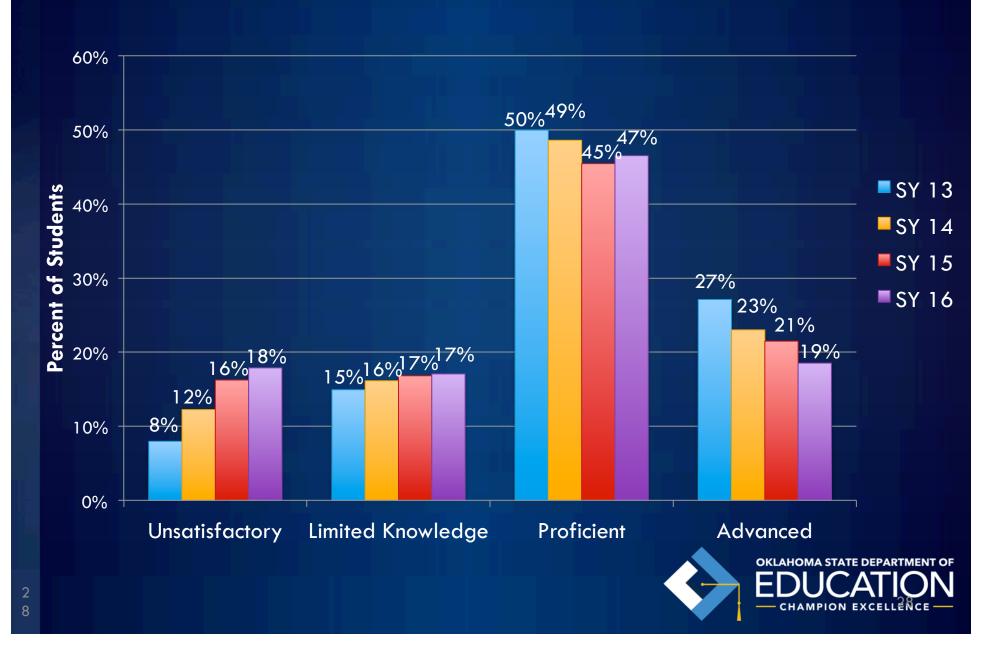


Importance of Comparability: Comparison of 2015 Proficiency Scores

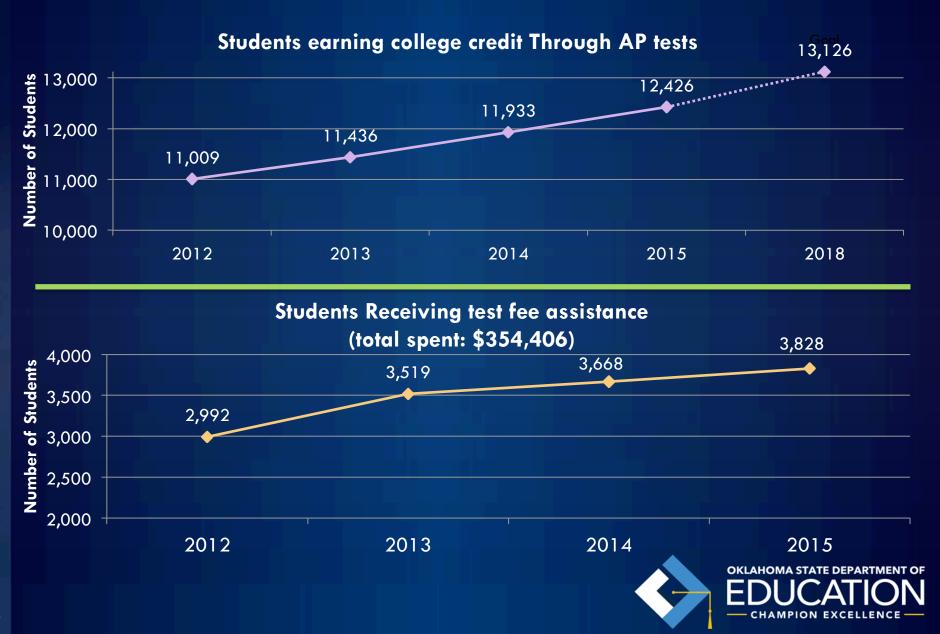

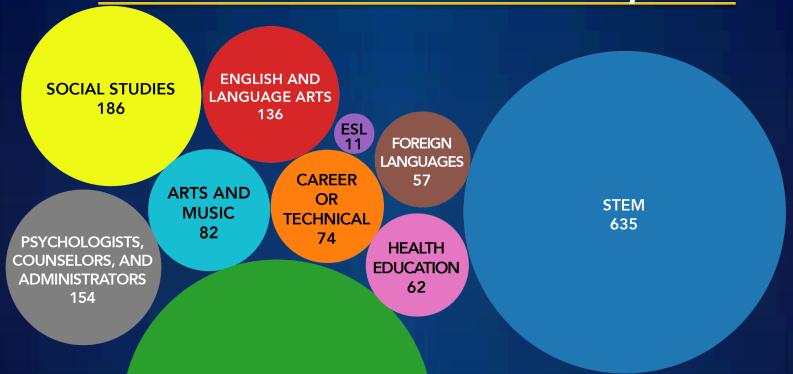

(Temporarily Non-Certified in Field of Need) Issued 2008-November 2015 by Field

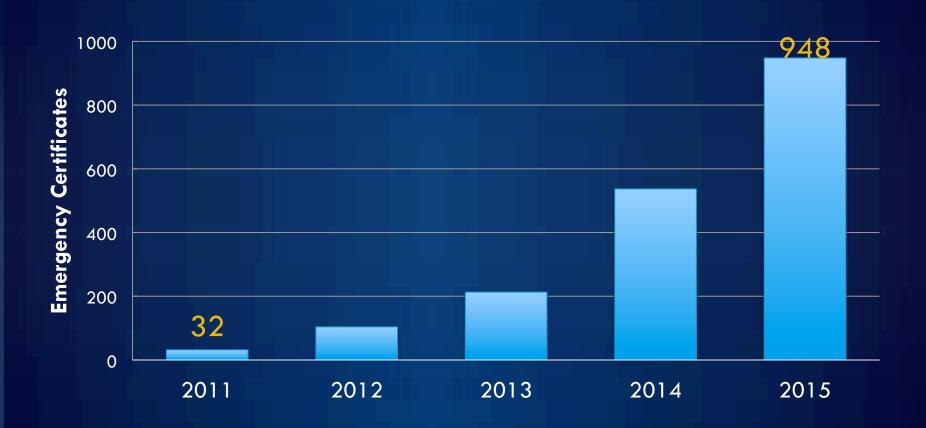

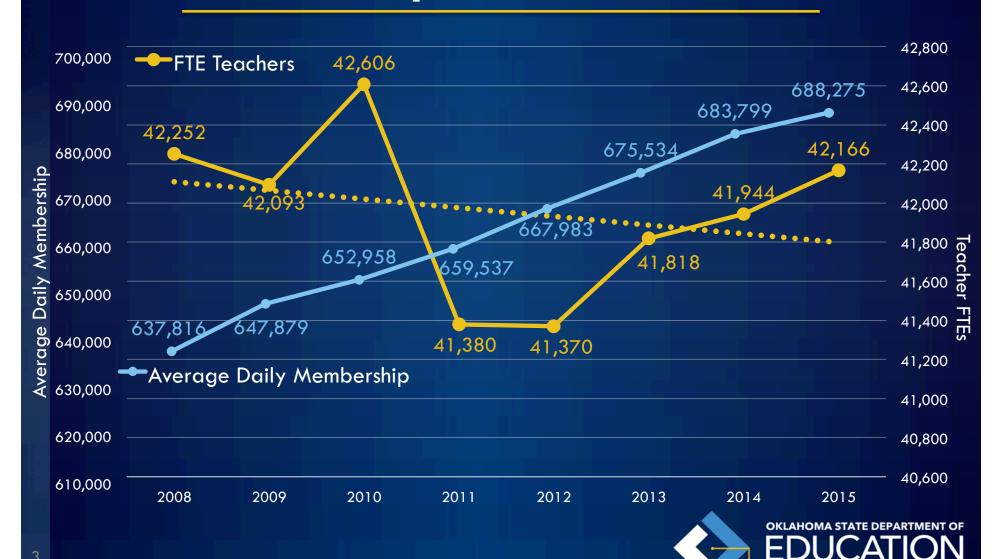
Emergency Certificates

(Temporarily Non-Certified in Field of Need) Issued 2011-November 2015 by Year

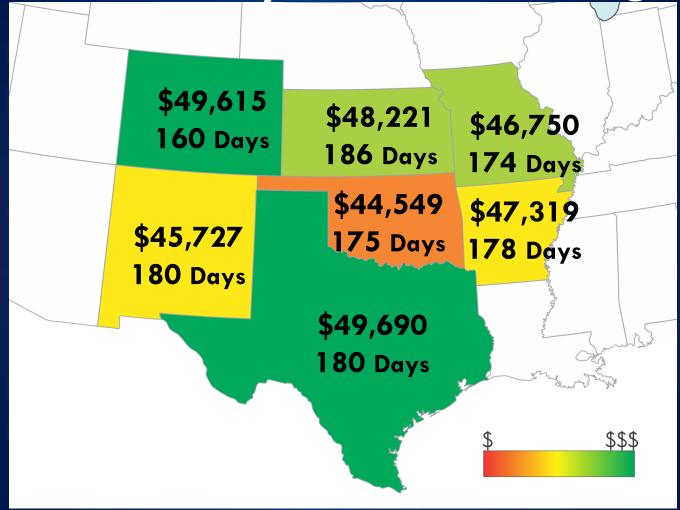




Student Population Growing while Teacher Population Fluctuates

Teacher Costs FAQs

Estimated Costs For:

- \$1,000 increase in Teacher Salary: **\$59,160,750**
- One additional day of Instruction: \$22,494,676
- Teacher Salary with Benefits:

\$38,322 Salary

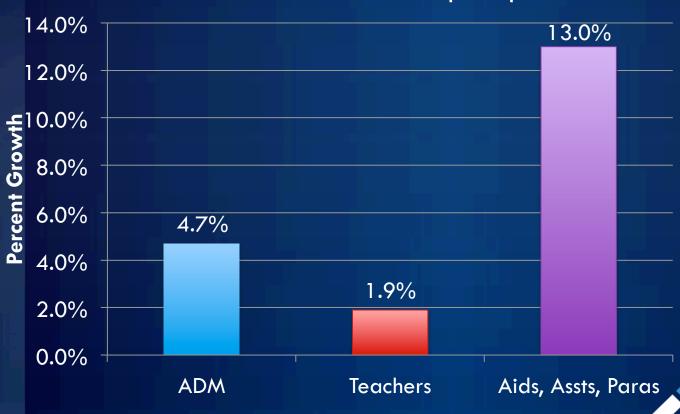
- + \$6,227 FBA & other benefits
- = \$44,549

Growth in Classroom Support Staff Since 2011

In the midst of a teacher shortage, we see evidence that schools are turning to teachers' aides, teachers' assistants and paraprofessionals to help fill the gap.





Teacher Shortage Task Force

- 9 Recommendations to Legislature
 - -Support Teachers (Teacher Residency Program)
 - Remove Barriers to Certification (testing, reciprocity, alternative certification, adjunct teachers)
 - Recruit and Incentivize (Teacher Recruitment Program, incentives to demographic areas, teacher/leader models)

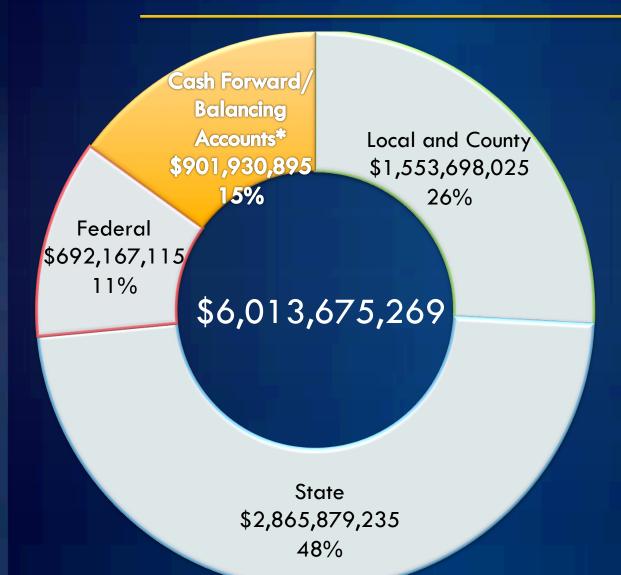

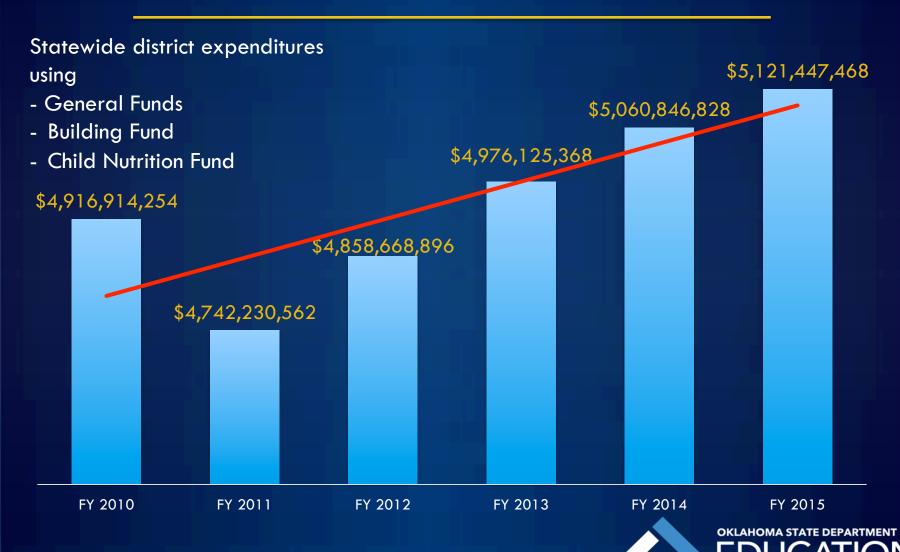




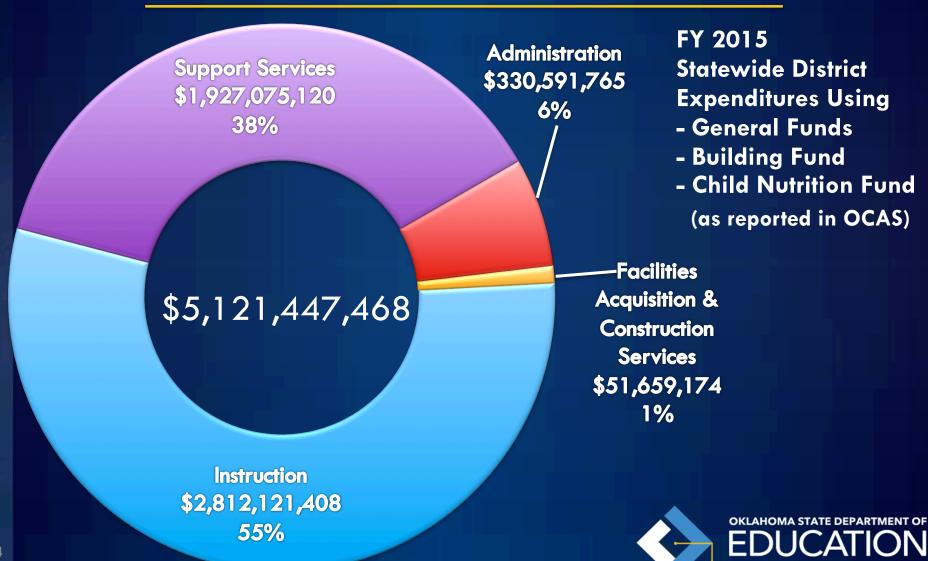

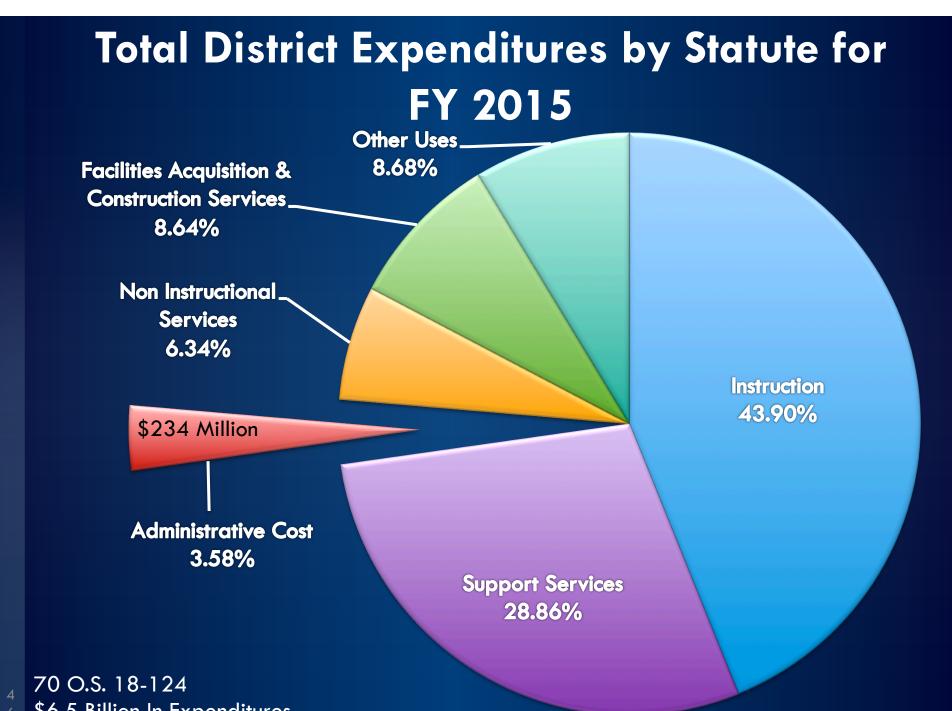


Statewide District Expenditures FY 2010 - 2015

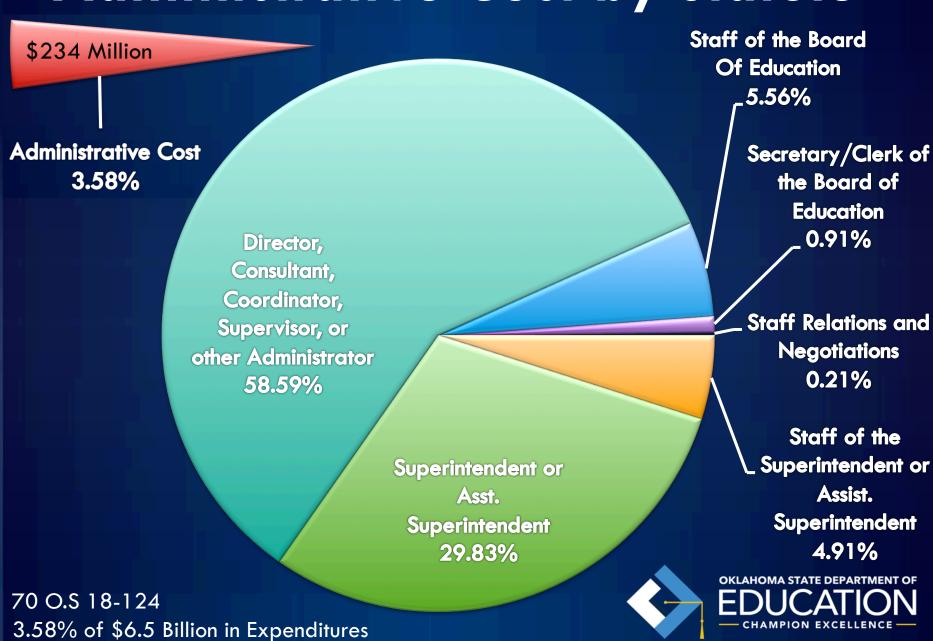


Statewide District Expenditures by OCAS
