# Preface

The *Oklahoma 2026–2027 Subject Codes for Grades PreK-12<sup>th</sup>* establish the standardized course coding structure used by Oklahoma school districts for student scheduling, transcript reporting, graduation requirement tracking, and statewide data reporting. Subject codes are reviewed and updated annually through a coordinated process within the Oklahoma State Department of Education (OSDE). The Standards and Learning Division serves as the process owner and leads the review of legislative changes, academic standards revisions, and instructional program updates that may require course code additions or modifications.

This work is conducted in collaboration with the Comprehensive School Counseling Program (CSCP) to ensure alignment with graduation requirements, student academic planning, and Individual Career and Academic Plan (ICAP) implementation. The Accreditation Office provides governance and research oversight to maintain the integrity of the Course Code Manual and prevent duplication of codes, while the Data and Information Systems Division supports technical implementation within statewide reporting systems and student information system structures. Through this collaborative process, OSDE ensures that course codes remain aligned with Oklahoma Academic Standards, graduation pathways, and statewide reporting requirements.

## Additional Subject Code Guidance (Grades 9-12)

**Graduation Requirements Courses** should be transcribed, reflecting the courses and competencies covered. For example, a concurrent course taken should be coded to the High School course with the level marked as "college" in the WAVE. New College subject codes have been added to be used when no other matching/aligned subject code is available. If you are embedding courses, both sets of competencies must be covered and both courses should be reflected on the transcript with the credit and grade earned.

**STEM Blocks** Course eligibility as a STEM Block course, allowable as a Math or Science credit for the core curriculum pathway towards graduation, must meet the minimum requirements set for Math and Science courses. Such courses must be aligned to the competencies at or above the rigor of Algebra I and Biology I respectively. Courses not including Math or Science content must include sets of competencies within computer education. Any course only addressing engineering, without the inclusion of Math, Science or Computer Science content, is not eligible.
