Vehicle Maintenance & Stormwater Facts

Washing vehicles or changing fluids in driveways sends toxic chemicals directly into Oklahoma stormwater systems. Simple maintenance keeps our local roads, public infrastructure, and waterways clean while saving money at the pump.

Manage Toxic Fluids

Motor oil and antifreeze are toxic to livestock, pets, and people. Keep fluids contained, use oil dry on spills, and drop off used oil at local auto parts stores for free recycling.

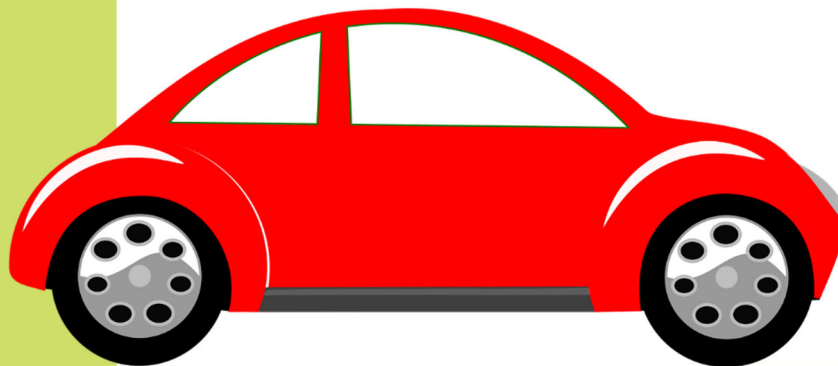


Commercial Car Washes

Neighborhood storm drains flow directly into local creeks and lakes without treatment. Commercial car washes are required by law to capture and treat their wastewater.

What can you do to help?

Maintain your vehicle. Never dispose of vehicle fluids down a storm drain.



Tire Pressure Saves Money

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Consider fewer trips!



Properly inflated tires improve fuel mileage, reduce tailpipe emissions, and prevent uneven tread wear. Keeping tires at the correct PSI also minimizes the amount of rubber debris shedding onto roadways and washing into ditches.

Keep Drains Clear

Trash, grass clippings, and leaves washed into storm drains clog drainage systems. This causes localized street flooding and creates costly cleanup work for municipal maintenance crews.
