# <u>Discussion and possible action to start the review of the 2023 National Electrical Code® (NEC®, 2023)</u>

Mr. Adcock stated the 2023 NEC was the latest edition of the code and there was another item for other codes later in the meeting. He recommended the Commission start the review. He added there was a timeline document in the commission books for rulemaking. He noted there was an April 1<sup>st</sup> deadline for filing with the Legislature and the document provided walked that backwards for when the review needed to be finished and still meet all the steps required for rulemaking. He added the last deadline for the committee to finish their review was November 14<sup>th</sup>, but he would push for way earlier as things always came up that could cause delays. He noted the code had been out since last fall. He added he would always push for review of every code, but that didn't mean every code had to be adopted, but made sure the Commission was not behind in reviewing code changes. Mr. Neal clarified the April 1<sup>st</sup> deadline Mr. Adcock had addressed was for submitting the rules to the Legislature and it was not the date those rules, if approved, would go into effect.

Discussion on the review of either the 2021 or 2024 Editions of the International Building Code®, International Existing Building Code®, International Fire Code®, International Fuel Gas Code®, International Mechanical Code®, and International Plumbing Code®

Mr. Adcock stated he was going to push to review every code. He noted the 2024 codes by the International Code Council were expected to be published in October and based on the timeline

they discussed earlier, it was not likely that those codes could be reviewed, and changes presented to the Commission by November 14<sup>th</sup> to meet all the rulemaking deadlines. He noted the discussion was if the commission wanted to adopt the 2021 codes, they could start now and the committees could be finished by the fall, but to adopt the 2024 codes, they would not be adopted next year, rather the following year based on timelines. He added the decision was where to move next. He stated either way they went, his opinion was to put the technical committees together, review the 2021 codes. He added if the Commission then decided to review the 2024 codes, that review became much less of a job. There was discussion on what the Commission should do, if they should skip a code cycle or review the 2021 codes; the number of changes between code cycles and if the committees would be doing double work to look at the 2021 and then looking at the 2024; and problems that get missed if a code isn't reviewed.
