CALL TO ORDER:

Mr. Mitchell Hort, Chairman of the Commission, called the regular meeting of the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission to order at 1:30 p.m. in the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission Board Room at Shepherd Center, 2401 NW 23rd St., Suite 82, Oklahoma City, OK 73107.

CONFIRMATION OF COMPLIANCE WITH THE OPEN MEETING ACT:

Mr. Adcock confirmed the meeting was in compliance with all requirements of the Open Meeting Act.

REPORTS:

CEO Report

Mr. David Adcock gave a report on different meetings he had attended to include both the OKC and Tulsa MABO groups; a meeting in Duncan that included the Summit Gas Utility, area plumbers, him, and the LP Gas Association; and a meeting with Independent Electrical Contractors Association. He noted that his messaging out to all the different industries to become more involved in the OUBCC and providing more communication with industries. He reported on the increased number of people signed up for agenda notices, noting an increase of 205 since his first meeting in April 2023 to December 2023. He updated the agency had received a "Preferred Provider" designation from ICC so any classes the agency did would get ICC CEUs. He added he had been working on classes with Generac, Uponor, and Navien, a Fireplace Installation Class and with ICC to set up classes for spring of 2024. Mr. Adcock noted he was still working to get changes to the OUBCC legislation to open the training up to industry other than just inspectors. He added staff was working with OMES on the agency website, noting the new website was about 75 percent completed and it was scheduled to go live in mid-January.

The Commission, Mr. Adcock, and staff discussed meeting with the Association of General Contractors; permit fees and the number of jurisdictions that were not reporting, the number of jurisdictions in total and the number that were current in reporting; code adoption and options the agency was working on with ICC to publish digital versions of the codes with the OUBCC amendments that will be posted on the website. The plan was to have that launch with the new website. There was further discussion on what the agency could link on the website and plans to link to the jurisdiction adoptions of the codes on the website.

Financial Report

OMES ABS was not in attendance for the meeting. Ms. Hehnly noted if anyone had any questions, she would try to answer them or would reach out to OMES for an answer. There were no questions for Ms. Hehnly.

Discussion and possible action on a public comment form received related the proposed adoption of the 2023 National Electrical Code[®]

Mr. Adcock stated the form came in he had made the decision it should go to the Commission rather than the committee as it was outside of the scope of the committee to act on. He added this was because it was the Commission who decided what codes should be adopted. He added the Mr. Neal, the agency's Assistant Attorney General concurred with that decision. He explained the proposal requested the National Electrical Code (NEC) not be updated and the State stay with the already adopted 2020 NEC. He noted the decision had been made to review the 2023 code, the committee had met, and the presentation had been given already. He stated they were ready to move forward with the adoption but felt the Commission should hear the proposal was there. There was some discussion on cities and resources it took to adopt the codes and if the committees could just look at the significant changes between the editions and draw those into the current code instead of adopting the new one. There was further discussion on the reasons to review each code cycle which included the number of changes on average, how continuing education would only be on the second cycle if a code edition was skipped; cities with ISO ratings; and the timing at the state for adopting codes.
