Mr. Larry Durham called meeting to order at 1:35p.m.

Mr. Taylor indicated the revised form was the change he submitted previously and was updated to address the 2024 code sections and language. He explained the change had to do with putting a neutralizer on 90 percent (efficient) heating devices. The committee discussed his research which stated the units could up to produce five gallons a day of runoff at 4-ph. They noted currently it wasn't an issue as there were not many units at 90 percent, but soon, all units could be which would increase the amount of runoff into a city's sewer system. They discussed possible damage to water treatment facilities and that lift station pumps may not be rated to that ph. level. There was further discussion on language in the IFGC® that was not in the IMC® or IPC®;

manufacturer's installation instructions; how long an acid neutralizer could last; how much they cost; maintenance of the neutralizer; and that 5 gallons was an average and the amounts would change based on actual usage. The committee discussed there wasn't much combustion discharge to the outdoors; that the change would only apply to commercial usage; and that neutralizers were a best practice.

She noted it was originally made by the Alternative Fuel Fueling Stations and Repair Garages technical committee who had discussed the emergency shutoff language for approximately 10-15 hours during various meetings. She noted the committee at the time consulted with the Corporation Commission, LP Gas Administration, and Labor Department (for CNG gas) as well as with other alternative fuels industry stakeholders, to come up with the language. She explained there were different shut off requirements for the different types of gases and when they were combined on one island, there were conflicts between those requirements, and the language on the form resolved those differences.

The committee discussed if the change they just approved for neutralizers in the last chapter needed to be included in Section 307.2.1; that the approved FGMP-48 R1 addressed fuel-burning appliances and the current section addressed evaporators; and that the code used to have a gravel pit requirement and somewhere along the way it went away. They discussed if there was a need to address each change separately; if freeze protection was needed for a cooling appliance; that it was not addressing fuel-burning appliances; if freezing was common; and what freeze protection was needed.

The committee discussed Section 401.2 Ventilation requirements. Concerns were expressed that natural ventilation was used a lot in multifamily housing and the language in the section forced mechanical ventilation as it stated dwelling units complying with the air leakage requirements of the IECC® were to be ventilated by mechanical means. There was some discussion on what was allowed in the residential code; standard industry practices; that on the design side it was a big

change; what was adopted for the residential code related to energy in Chapter 11; and that there was no energy code adopted on the commercial side. Staff recommended if someone felt it was necessary, a code change proposal form should be submitted, and approval of the chapter tabled until that was addressed.
