Hydrant fire flow criteria is a jurisdictional overlap which causes project planning confusion which can cause late cancellation of projects, owner waste, and frustration with the Oklahoma State Fire Marshal and the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality.
ODEQ § 252:626-3-6(c)(6) requires public water supply construction or modification to provide fire flow in accordance with IFC 2003, AWWA M31, or other recommendations of similar organizations for the fire service area.
IFC § 507.3 requires fire flow methods to be approved by the state fire marshal. However, since there is no guidance within IFC, the fire marshal defers to ODEQ, who does not provide detailed guidance past the vague direction listed above in ODEQ regulations.
Adoption of IFC Appendix B provides a more structured framework for fire flow requirements across Oklahoma which will aid in project planning.
