Most of the time spent inside storm shelters is while waiting for storms to pass and plumbing systems are operating normally. The required duration of emergency systems for tornado shelters is only 2 hours. The short time frame should not required the space and cost of the storage capacities if a tornado does impact the normal operation of water supply / waste removal.
