Chapter 2 Definitions

Previous Change

IBC:

(1) 310.4 Residential Group R-3. Residential Group R-3 occupancies where the occupants are primarily permanent in nature and not classified as a Group R-1, R-2, R-4 or I, including:

Buildings that do not contain more than two dwelling units

Care facilities that provide accommodations for five or fewer occupants

Boarding houses (nontransient)

Congregate living facilities (nontransient) with 16 or fewer occupancies

Convents

Dormitories

Fraternities and sororities

Monasteries

Congregate living facilities (transient) with 10 or fewer occupants

Boarding houses (transient)

Lodging houses (transient) with <u>five four</u> or fewer guest rooms and <u>10 or fewer occupants</u> <u>no more than 2 persons per room</u>.

(2) 310.4.2 Lodging houses. Owner-occupied lodging houses with five four or fewer guest rooms and 10 or fewer total occupants no more than 2 persons per room shall be permitted to be constructed in accordance with the International Residential Code, provided that an automatic sprinkler system is installed in accordance with Section 903.3.1.3 or Section P2904 of the International Residential Code®.

IFC:

(16) [BG] Residential Group R-3. Residential Group R-3 occupancies where the occupants are primarily permanent in nature and not classified as a Group R-1, R-2, R-4 or I, including: Buildings that do not contain more than two dwelling units

Care facilities that provide accommodations for five or fewer occupants

Boarding houses (nontransient)

Congregate living facilities (nontransient) with 16 or fewer occupancies

Convents

Dormitories

Fraternities and sororities

Monasteries

Congregate living facilities (transient) with 10 or fewer occupants

Boarding houses (transient)

Lodging houses (transient) with <u>five four</u> or fewer guest rooms and <u>10 or fewer occupants</u> <u>no</u> more than 2 persons per room.

[BG] Care facilities within a dwelling. Care facilities for five or fewer persons receiving care that are within a single-family dwelling are permitted to comply with the International Residential Code provided an automatic sprinkler system is installed in accordance with Section 903.1.3 or Section P2904 of the International Residential Code®.

[BG]Lodging houses. Owner-occupied lodging houses with five (four) or fewer guest rooms and 10 or fewer total occupants no more than 2 persons per room shall be permitted to be constructed in accordance with the International Residential Code[®].

Historical Information

This same change was made to both codes to meet the requirements in Title 74 O.S. 317.1. The statute is still in effect and the change should be carried forward. The highlighted language in the change to the IBC is new language added in the 2021 edition of the code.

The committee should determine if the new language should be included as published, modified, or deleted from the agency rules.
