Supporting Information

1. Obsolete Risk Basis

- The section was written to protect against open incandescent lamps, which are no longer standard.
- Modern enclosed LED lights emit minimal heat, have sealed housings, and are not shock hazards in residential closet installations.

2. Design Limitation Without Safety Justification

- These clearance rules restrict fixture placement in **small or custom closets**, where space is already limited.
- This leads to reduced illumination, or encourages homeowners to install noncompliant solutions to improve visibility.

3. Lack of Supporting Safety Data

- No injury or fire data exists showing safety incidents tied to properly installed enclosed LED luminaires in closets.
- In fact, misapplied rules may push lights into less practical and potentially riskier positions.

4. Redundancy Within the Code

- General luminaire safety requirements under **NEC Article 410** already address:
 - o Proper mounting
 - Protection from mechanical damage
 - Compatibility with damp or enclosed environments
- These rules render 410.16(A) and (D) redundant in today's construction landscape.
