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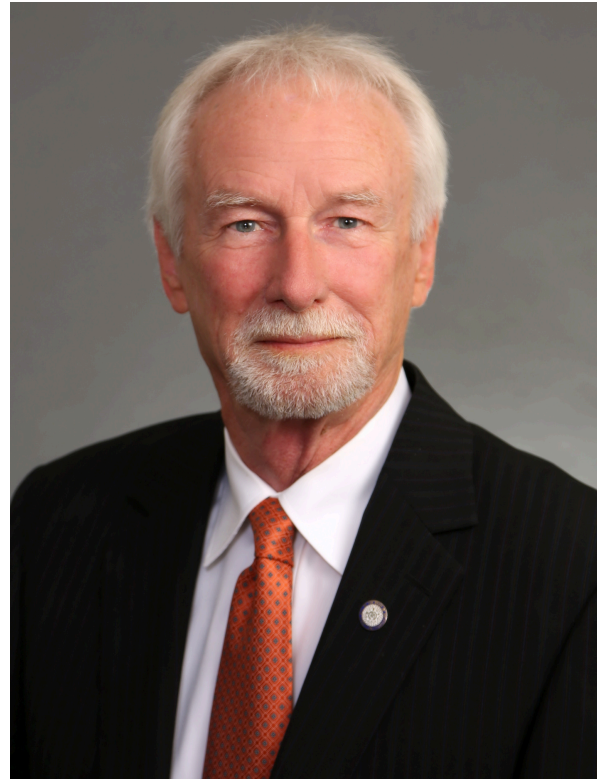

Remembering Glen W. Smith, PE, PLS

We are sad to report that Glen Smith passed away on September 8, 2025, after recently concluding his third six-year term as a member of the State Board of Licensure for Professional Engineers and Surveyors, marking the end of an extraordinary 18-year tenure. Originally appointed in 2006 by Governor Brad Henry, Smith was reappointed by Governor Mary Fallin and again by Governor Kevin Stitt.

Mr. Smith demonstrated exceptional dedication to the advancement of the engineering and surveying professions. He played a key role in a wide array of board initiatives and contributed extensively to interprofessional collaboration. He served on Joint Task Force Committees between OSLS, the Board of Architects, and the Board, promoting unity and mutual understanding across the design professions and helping to shape a more coordinated regulatory environment.

At the national level, Mr. Smith represented Oklahoma with distinction within the NCEES. In 2019, in recognition of his outstanding service and contributions, he received the NCEES Southern Zone Distinguished Service Award. Mr. Smith also mentored numerous young engineers and surveyors throughout his career, as well as new board members.



While this overview provides only a snapshot of Mr. Smith's extensive service, it reflects the deep and lasting impact of his contributions. His dedication, insight, and leadership have left an enduring legacy within the Board, the State of Oklahoma, and the engineering and surveying communities.

Mr. Smith graduated from Oklahoma State University in 1971 with a degree in Agricultural Engineering and was a lifelong OSU fan. He was licensed as both a professional engineer and a professional surveyor. In 1981, Mr. Smith co-founded Smith-Roberts and Associates and later founded PZR—Planning, Zoning, and Resources—a civil engineering and surveying company in Oklahoma City.

Glen Smith, along with his wife Bonnie, made significant contributions and sacrifices throughout his tenure on the Board in service to the state of Oklahoma. We will forever miss his wisdom, guidance, and friendship.

Newly Appointed Board Member Jeff Cowan, P.E. From Local Roots to Statewide Impact

Jeff Cowan, P.E., was recently appointed by Governor J. Kevin Stitt to serve as a professional engineering member of the Board, serving a 6-year term from July 1, 2025, to June 30, 2031.

Born and raised in Oklahoma City, Jeff Cowan, P.E., has built a career defined by vision, dedication, and service to his community. After earning his bachelor's degree in civil engineering from Oklahoma State University, Mr. Cowan began his professional journey with the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) before transitioning into private consulting with Oklahoma-based design firms.

Over the past 35 years, he has led the management and design of civil infrastructure projects across the state, guiding federal, state, and local government initiatives from concept to completion. His career reached a defining milestone in 2012 when his long-time dream became reality—founding Cowan Group Engineering (CGE).



Under his leadership as Corporate Executive Officer, CGE has grown from just three employees to a team of more than 55 by 2025, offering design, land surveying, and construction engineering and inspection services. Specializing in water, wastewater, drainage, and transportation projects, CGE has earned national and local recognition, including Inc. Magazine's Fastest Growing Companies in America list in 2017 and 2018, and the Greater Oklahoma City Chamber's Metro 50 Fastest Growing Companies honor in 2018.

When he's not leading CGE toward continued growth, Mr. Cowan can be found enjoying the thrill of Formula 1 and MotoGP motorsports—or savoring a good cup of coffee with a favorite book in hand.

FEBRUARY 2025

Process Engineers & Equipment Corporation, Case No. 2022-094

Through Consent: Process Engineers & Equipment Corporation did not have a Certificate of Authorization in the State of Oklahoma at the time it offered and/or performed engineering services in the State of Oklahoma. In this regard Process Engineers & Equipment Corporation was found Guilty, assessed an administrative fine of \$1,000 and ordered to Cease and Desist from practicing and/or offering to practice engineering in the State of Oklahoma until such time as it has been legally authorized to do so.

Landmark Surveying, CA 1281 and Brett King, PS 1533, Case No. 2024-038,

Through Consent: Landmark Surveying and Brett King failed to achieve minimum standards as required by the Oklahoma Minimum Standards for the Practice of Surveying and failed to discharge their duties, obligations, and responsibilities as a professional surveyor and firm in the State of Oklahoma which evidences a careless and reckless disregard for the property and welfare of others. In this regard Landmark Surveying and was found Guilty and assessed an administrative fine of \$3,000. Brett King was found Guilty and assessed an administrative fine of \$3,000.

Gerald Charlton, PE 28722 (I), Case No. 2024-094

Through Consent: Gerald Charlton was found Guilty of failing to submit a complete permanent professional engineer application to the Board within (30) days of the date of the issuance of the Temporary License. In this regard Gerald Charlton was found Guilty and assessed an administrative fine of \$1,000.

Morgan Landon, PE 23314, Case No. 2025-001

Through Surrender: Morgan Landon surrendered his Certificate of Licensure to the Board in lieu of administrative action.

APRIL 2025

Brown Engineering, PC, CA2659; Michael D. Brown, PE 22128; Richard Brown, PE 9135, Case No. 2024-084

Through Consent: Brown Engineering, PC and Michael Brown, PE were found Guilty of violating terms imposed by the Board in a prior enforcement action. In this regard Brown Engineering, PC was found Guilty and assessed an administrative fine of \$2,500. Michael Brown was found Guilty and assessed an administrative fine of \$2,500. Richard Brown surrendered his Certificate of Licensure to the Board in lieu of administrative action.

John Dougherty, PE 30813 (I), Case No. 2024-141

Through Consent: John Dougherty was convicted of a felony crime that substantially relates to the practice of engineering, poses a reasonable threat to public safety, and has a bearing on his fitness or ability to serve the public or work with others in the occupation. In this regard John Dougherty was found Guilty and Suspended until such time as he has completed his sentence including probation.

Lincoln Land Surveyors, Inc., CA 1123; Edmond Schooley, PLS 1358, Case No. 2025-002

Through Consent: Lincoln Land Surveyors, Inc., CA and Edmond Schooley prepared, signed, sealed and issued a Mortgage Inspection Report, that failed to achieve minimum standards as required by the Oklahoma Minimum Standards for the Practice of Surveying. Lincoln Land Surveyors, Inc. was found Guilty and assessed an administrative fine of \$850. Edmond Schooley was found Guilty and assessed an administrative fine of \$850.

APRIL 2025

Alva Levins, PLS 1746, Case No. 2025-005

Through Consent: Alva Levins provided false information to the Board when he certified he had completed his required continuing education at the time of his license renewal for his Professional Surveyor Certificate of Licensure and failed to comply with the Continuing Education Audit. In this regard Alva Levins was found Guilty, assessed an administrative fine of \$3,000 and Suspended until such time he provides proof of completion of 30 acceptable PDHs with supporting documentation to the Board.

James Miller, PE 1548, Case No. 2025-006

Through Consent: James Miller provided false information to the Board when he certified he had completed his required continuing education at the time of his license renewal for his Professional Surveyor Certificate of Licensure when he had not and failed to comply with the Continuing Education Audit. In this regard James Miller was found Guilty, assessed an administrative fine of \$3,000 and Suspended until such time he provides proof of completion of 30 acceptable PDHs.

JUNE 2025

Gerald Charlton, PE 28722 (I), Case No. 2024-094

Through Consent: Gerald Charlton was found Guilty of failing to submit a complete permanent professional engineer application to the Board within (30) days of the date of the issuance of the Temporary License. In this regard Gerald Charlton was found Guilty and assessed an administrative fine of \$1,000.

Barrett C. Crook, PE 27882, Case No. 2024-124

Through Consent: Barrett Crook was found Guilty of violating laws or rules of another state that are the same or substantially equivalent to Oklahoma law, failing to provide information to the Board within 30 days regarding an investigation, and performing structural engineering work for a project that meets the "significant structure" definition without being licensed as an Oklahoma Professional Structural Engineer. In this regard Barrett C. Crook was found Guilty, assessed an administrative fine of \$6,000, and his Professional Engineer License was Suspended until such time as he submits a complete response to the request for information and complies with all other terms of the Order.

Michael Solitro, PLS 2069, Case No. 2024-0124

Agreement to Surrender License and Dismissal of Counts: Michael Solitro surrenders his Certificate of Licensure PLS 2069 in lieu of administrative action.

Quamrul Mazumder, PE 17923, Case No. 2025-007

Through Consent: Quamrul Mazumder provided false information to the Board when he certified he had completed his required continuing education at the time of his license renewal for his Professional Surveyor Certificate of Licensure and failed to comply with the Continuing Education Audit. In this regard Quamrul Mazumder was found Guilty, assessed an administrative fine of \$1,000, and Suspended until such time as he provides 20 additional qualifying PDH's for the renewal period.

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JUNE 2025 CONTINUED

PWP Structural Engineers, LLC, CA 7056, Michael Livingston, PE 35671, Case No. 2025-018

Through Consent: Michael Livingston did not have an Oklahoma Professional Engineer license at the time he offered and/or performed engineering services on an Oklahoma project. PWP Structural Engineers did not have a Certificate of Authorization in the State of Oklahoma at the time they offered to practice and/or practiced engineering services on an Oklahoma project. In this regard Michael Livingston and PWP Structural Engineers were found Guilty and each assessed an administrative fine of \$1,000.

Barrett C. Crook, PE 27882, Case No. 2024-124

Through Consent: Barrett Crook was found Guilty of violating laws or rules of another state that are the same or substantially equivalent to Oklahoma law, failing to provide information to the Board within 30 days regarding an investigation, and performing structural engineering work for a project that meets the “significant structure” definition without being licensed as an Oklahoma Professional Structural Engineer. In this regard Barrett C. Crook was found Guilty, assessed an administrative fine of \$6,000, and his Professional Engineer License was Suspended until such time as he submits a complete response to the request for information and complies with all other terms of the Order.

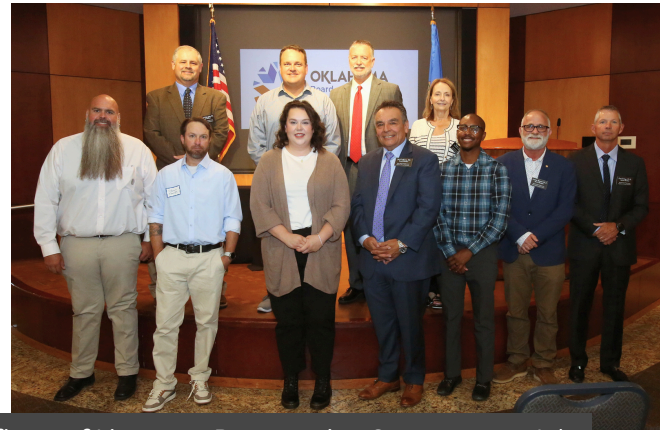
Master Lift Foundation Repair, LLC, CA 7735 (Inactive), Case No. 2025-003

Through Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Final Order: Master Lift Foundation Repair, LLC (the Firm) was authorized to practice engineering in the state of Oklahoma through Certificate of Authorization number 7735 until February 28, 2018. At such time, the Board was notified that the Firm no longer employed a professional engineer licensed in the state of Oklahoma to be in responsible charge of any engineering work and the Firm's Certificate of Authorization was inactivated. Following notification of such, the Firm continued to exhibit a digital image of their Certificate of Authorization on multiple pages of their public internet website and make statements on this website purporting they were authorized to perform engineering in the state of Oklahoma. In late 2024, the Board office received a complaint from a member of the public who thought this firm was an authorized engineering firm because of the inaccurate information still exhibited on their public internet website. The Firm was sent an administrative cease and desist letter by the investigative committee of the Board, requesting that they immediately remove all inaccurate information from the website. The Firm made some edits to the website, but misleading claims were still present. On June 26, 2025, the Board conducted a formal hearing and found the Firm guilty by clear and convincing evidence of offering to practice engineering services in the state of Oklahoma without an active Certificate of Authorization to do so. The Firm was assessed an administrative fine of \$7,500 and ordered to Cease and Desist offering or practicing engineering in the State of Oklahoma without a valid Certificate of Authorization. The Office of the Attorney General issued an official opinion on August 19, 2025, upholding the Board's ruling.

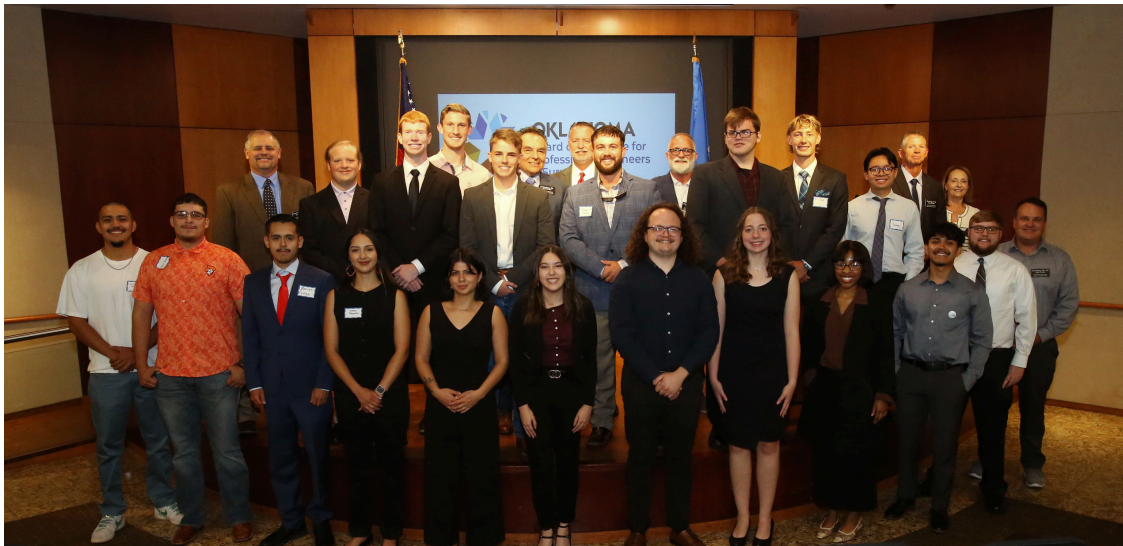

Interested in Retiring Your P.E. or P.S. License?

OAR: 245:15-7-1(c) states, "When a professional engineer or land surveyor in good standing desires to retire his or her license, he or she may do so upon application to the Board, subject to reinstatement and continuing education requirements by the Board." If retirement is the reason for not renewing your license and you choose to place your license on Retired status, you may do so from the online renewal site. Register and log in to your online renewal account, select "Renew", then choose the retirement option when prompted and complete the process online. By choosing the Retired status, you will no longer be required to earn continuing education hours or be required to pay a fee. However, you will not be allowed to practice your profession in Oklahoma. You will receive a wallet card showing Retired status and you will remain on the Board's online roster as Retired. PLEASE NOTE: If you renew your license and certify that you have met the continuing education requirements, you shall NOT be allowed to retire your license after the fact in lieu of an administrative action if you are chosen for audit and do not have the required hours.

Administrative Rule Revisions Proposed - Public Meeting Announced

A public meeting will be held at the Oklahoma Engineering and Design Professionals Building, 220 NE 28th St., Oklahoma City, OK, on November 13, 2025, at 3:30 pm to accept public comments regarding the proposed revisions.
