

**Pursuant to Title 59 O.S. 4100.8 (Military Service Occupation,
Education and Credentialing Act), the following provisions shall be
effective November 1, 2019**

Active duty military personnel and their spouses are entitled to:

1. A waiver of comity Professional Engineer (P.E.) and Professional Land Surveyor (P.L.S.) application fees, as well as a waiver of their first pro-rated license renewal fee, and if applicable,
2. A one-time waiver of the Temporary License fee.

Comity P.E. Application Instructions:

1. Comity P.E. applicants that meet the licensure eligibility requirements specified in the Board's Statutes O.S. Title 59, Sections 475.12a(C) and OAC 245:15-3-9, will be issued a P.E. license within thirty (30) days of receipt of a complete application meeting all Board requirements.
2. Temporary Licenses for P.E.'s will be issued within 3 business days of receipt of a completed application meeting all Board requirements as specified in O.S. Title 59, 475.22(2)(a) and OAC 245:15-3-10.

Comity P.L.S. Application Instructions:

1. Upon receipt of a complete comity P.L.S. application meeting the licensure eligibility requirements specified in Board Statutes O.S. Title 59, Sections 475.12b(C) and OAC 245:15-3-9, Board staff will contact the applicant to schedule the Oklahoma Law and Surveying (OLS) state-specific surveying examination. Active duty military personnel and their spouses will be allowed to schedule the OLS exam within ten (10) business days of receipt of the complete P.L.S. application meeting Board requirements. Upon passing the OLS examination, a P.L.S. license will be issued to the applicant within thirty (30) days.

ADDITIONAL DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED:

- All active duty military personnel entitled to fee waivers and expedited application approval pursuant to the Military Service Occupation, Education and Credentialing Act must submit appropriate documentation showing proof of current military service or recent discharge as part of their application package.
- In addition to the above documentation, spouses must also submit proof of lawful marriage to a qualifying active duty military person.
