1 Call to Order

Chairman Robert Reavis called the May 2026 Regular Meeting of the Pardon and Parole Board (PPB) to order at 9:00 a.m. on Monday, May 11, 2026, at the Oklahoma Healthcare Authority Building and via Zoom.

A. Roll Call

B. Assurance of Compliance with Open Meeting Act

General Counsel Alejandra Brigida provided assurance of compliance with the Open Meeting Act. The business meeting of the Pardon and Parole Board was convened in accordance with the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act. This meeting was preceded by an advance notice of the date, time, and place filed with the Oklahoma Secretary of State on September 24, 2025.

Notice of this meeting was also given at least twenty-four (24) hours in advance of the meeting by posting notice of the date, time, virtual meeting place, and agenda of the meeting on May 4, 2026, on the Pardon and Parole Board's website, www.ok.gov/ppb. The meeting is in compliance with the Open Meeting Act.

2 Review, Discussion, and Approval of Minutes

A. April 2026 Regular Meeting

The April 2026 Regular Meeting minutes were provided to the Board for review. Kevin Buchanan made a motion to approve the April 2026 Regular Meeting minutes, Sean Malloy seconded. The motion was carried by a vote of 5-0.

B. Raymond Johnson Clemency Hearing

The minutes for Raymond Johnson's clemency hearing were provided to the Board for review. Richard Miller made a motion to approve the clemency hearing minutes, Sean Malloy seconded. The motion was carried by a vote of 5-0.

3 Agency Updates

- **Office and Personnel Updates**

Deputy Director Melinda Romero reported the position of Executive Administrative Assistant was filled by Chyne Morris.

- **Field Updates**

Field Director Leroy Long reported ongoing work for the June docket to conclude on Friday, and that Red Rock Correctional Facility changed its name to James Smith Correctional Facility effective 5/4/2026.

General Counsel Alejandra Brigida announced no legal updates.

Executive Director Kyle Counts announced no additional agency updates.

4 Legislative Update

General Counsel Alejandra Brigida announced that our requested bill, SB 12224 by Colin Duell of the House and Darcy Jack of the Senate passed the Oklahoma House on third reading with unanimous support, 91-0, authorizing electronic notifications to victims and victims' representatives. Our other requested bill, SB 1330 by Carl Newton of the House and Darcy Jack of the Senate, regarding increased compensation for members of the Oklahoma Pardon and Parole Board, has been available for consideration on the House floor agenda since April 29, 2026. Governor Stitt already signed SB 1156, which appropriates the money to fund that statutory change in SB 13330. At this time, approximately 20 measures remain to be considered by the House, and based on the current legislative schedule, SB 1330 is expected to be heard and voted on this month. We will continue monitoring floor activity and provide the Board with any updates regarding the bill's progress or final disposition. SB 1255, a bill that grants the Medical Director of the Department of Corrections the authority to request that an inmate be reviewed for Medical Parole rather than the Director of the Department, became law without the Governor's signature on April 6, 2026.

5 Discussion and Possible Action on Pardon Applicants

The Board heard presentations and interviewed pardon applicants beginning at 9:40 a.m. The vote of the Board was recorded and is reflected on each applicant's ballot. The ballot for each applicant is available for inspection at the Administrative Office of the PPB in accordance with the Open Records Act.
