FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT VICTIM PROTEST FORM**

**Do I need to answer all five questions?** No, answer whichever questions you want. The questions are designed to enhance the process and there are no right, wrong, or required answers.

**Answering these questions is emotional and stressful for me, how long should my answers be?** You may write as little or as much as you need. Often a few words can convey more to the Board than a hundred words.

**Is a written protest as effective as protesting in person?** Yes. For some victims, a written protest is easier, while others may prefer to protest in person. It is your decision whether you wish to appear. The Board is more interested in what you have to say, than whether you say it in writing or in person.

**If a victim or victim's representative submits a protest letter for a pardon, parole, or commutation, is it kept confidential?**

Yes, if the victim or a victim's representative submits a protest letter, the victim's name, address, and the content of the letter is kept confidential.
