- *Yes = Votes in favor of parole/probation*
- *% = percentage of specific docket category*
- *An affirmative vote for Non-Violent is an approval and an affirmative vote for Violent is a recommendation to the governor*
- *All Other Dockets = Special Review, Medical, Re-Entry, In-Absentia, and Pass Dockets: Data specifics are available upon request*
- *Commutation, Administrative, Pardon, and SIR Dockets were not marked as Violent and Non-Violent and can only be tallied as an affirmative or non-affirmative vote at this time*
- *Note: Three Board Members had to vote Yes on a Docket to equal a “Board’s Parole Recommended and Approval” affirmative vote*
- *Note: (n=0) cases were on the Pass Docket this month and no vote occurred*
- *Note: Richard Smothermon recused (n=2) votes this month*
- *Note: Cathy Stocker recused (n=1) vote this month*
