

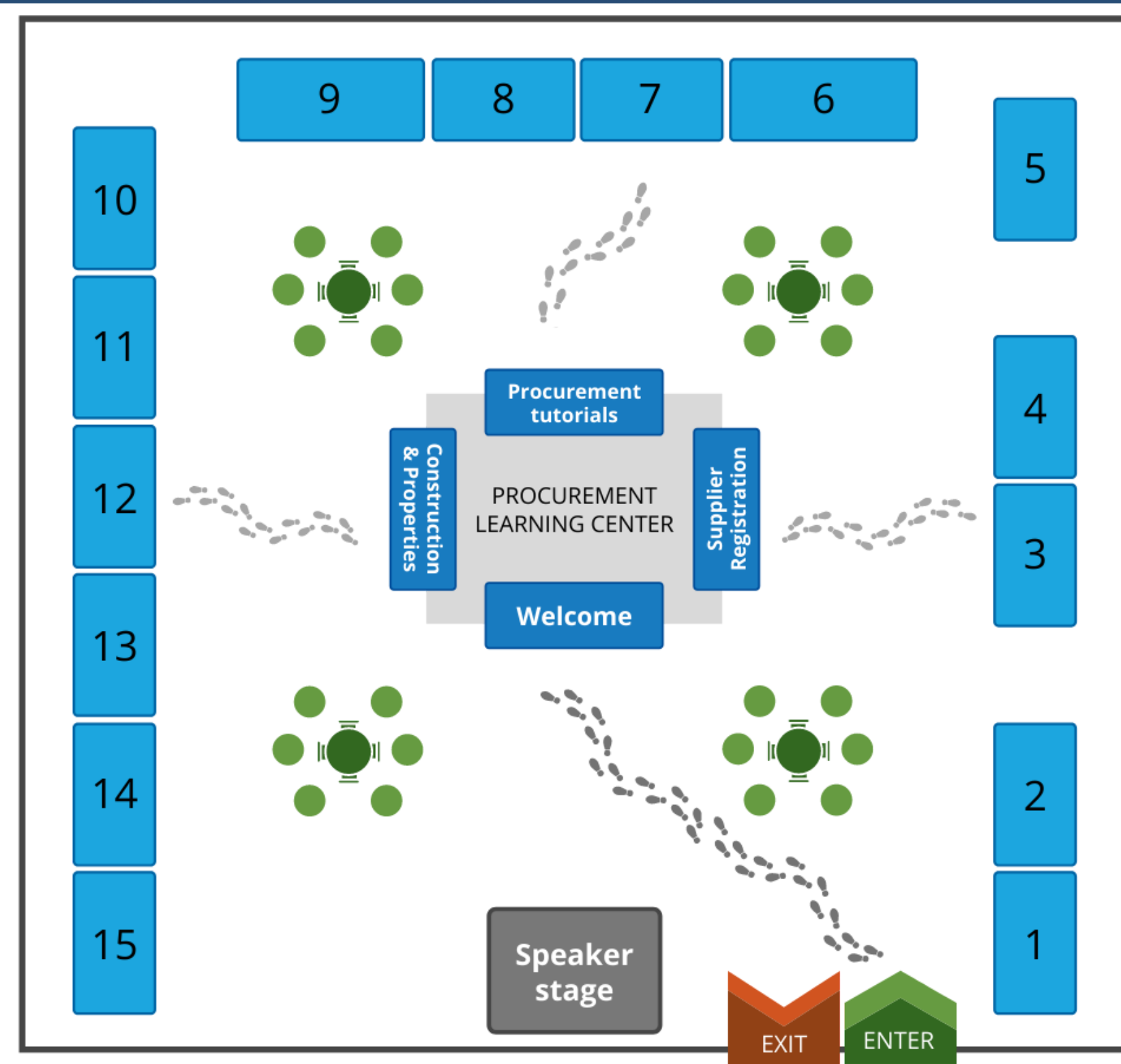

## WHAT TO EXPECT AS A BOOTH VOLUNTEER:

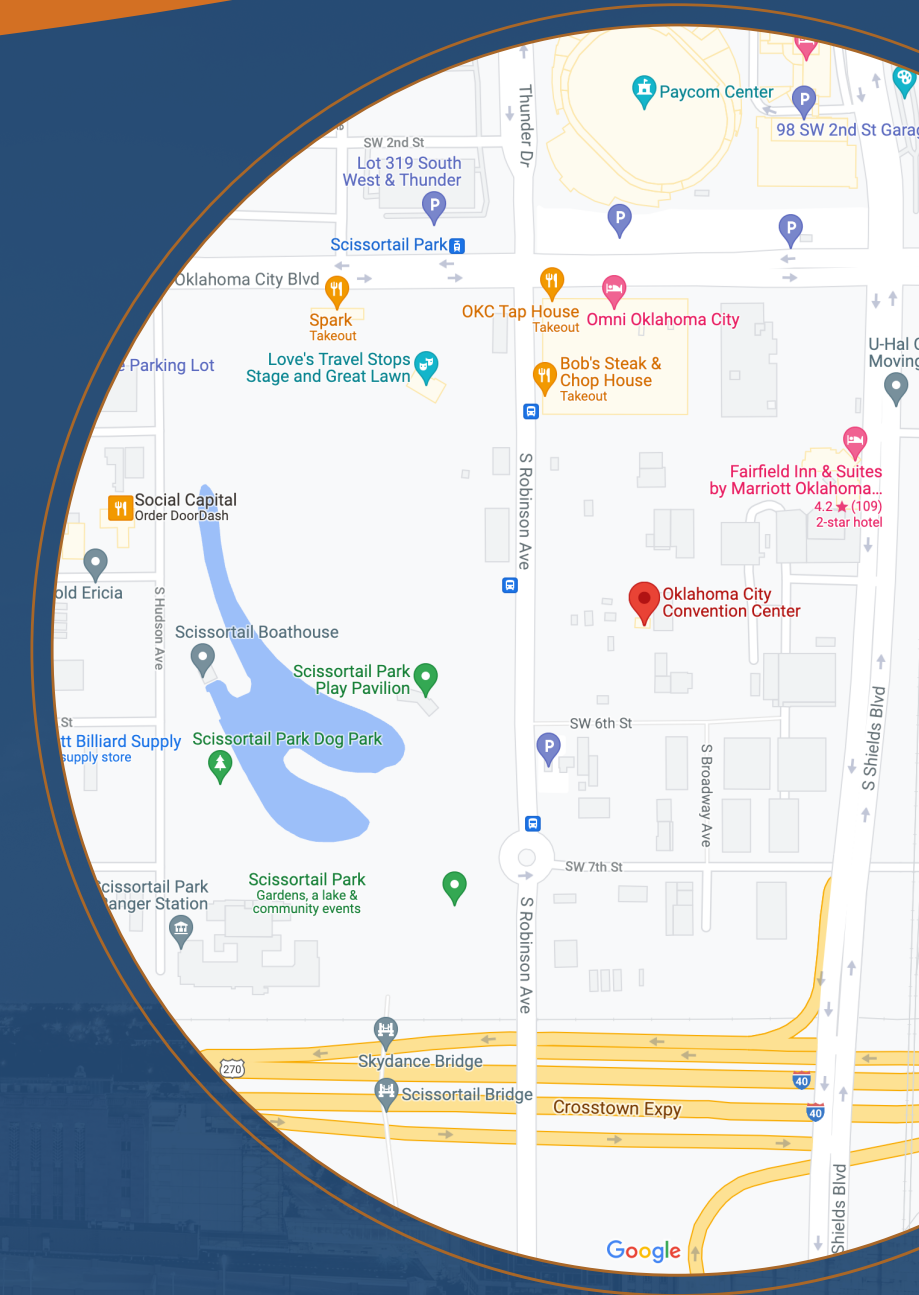
- Be personable and engaging.

**HEARING COORDINATION AND TRACKING SYSTEM**  
Modernize the Department of Human Services' current information management system and paper form-based hearing system.


**OK STEPS**  
Web-based application for the Dept. of Veterans Affairs to enable Oklahoma veterans to better identify needed resources available near them. This project is slated for FY 2022.

**VITAL RECORDS ROVER REPLACEMENT**  
Modernization of the Department of Health's vital records ROVER system – Registering Oklahoma Vital Event Records. This project is slated for FY 2022.

**STATEWIDE FIBER EXPANSION**  
More rural bandwidth construction, fiber, network, firewall, server, construction opportunities. This project is slated for fiscal year 2022-2023.

**NETWORK THREAT DETECTION**  
Need a solution for analyzing an entire security ecosystem to identify any malicious activity that could compromise the state network. This project is slated for FY 2023-2024.

**BANKING TRANSFORMATION**  
Replace the state treasurer's legacy banking systems. This includes retiring the mainframe and Oracle platform on which these legacy systems reside. This project is slated for FY 2023.
