## OKLAHOMA TAX COMMISSION REGULAR MEETING MINUTES February 15, 2022

1. The regularly scheduled meeting of the Oklahoma Tax Commission convened at 1:30 p.m., on the above date. - 2. READING OF MINUTES Secretary-Member Prater moved that the Commission approve the minutes of the regular commission meeting on February 8, 2022. Vice-Chairman Wood seconded the motion. Chairman, aye; Vice-Chairman, aye; Secretary-Member, aye. The motion was declared adopted.
- 3. The FY 2022 re-estimate and FY 2023 forecast of State of Oklahoma revenues administered by the Oklahoma Tax Commission for the State of Oklahoma Equalization Board meeting scheduled to be held February 22, 2022 was presented to the Commissioners by Rick Miller, Director of Tax Policy, Dr. Huan Gong, Dr. Dan Rickman and Dr. Mark Sneed.

Vice-Chairman Wood moved that the Commission approve the FY 2022 re-estimate and FY 2023 forecast of State of Oklahoma revenues administered by the Oklahoma Tax Commission for the State of Oklahoma Equalization Board meeting scheduled to be held February 22, 2022.
