

TSET Discovery Grant Q&A November 1, 2023

- 1. Can this funding reimburse for community projects that will begin prior to July 1, 2024?
 - a. No. Eligible cost reimbursement items may only be purchased on or after the effective date of having a signed contract with TSET.
- 2. Is the installation of signage for walking trails considered capital improvement?
 - a. Signage installation for walking trails is not considered a capital improvement.
- 3. Evaluation and Expected Outcomes: Does TSET assign a program evaluator or does the applicant find a program evaluator? If the applicant is responsible for the program evaluator, can the program evaluator also be the project manager?
 - a. The applicant is responsible for developing an evaluation plan/design for the proposed program as part of their application. Applications awarded funding may be required to work with an assigned TSET evaluator if TSET determines the design proposed needs additional guidance and support. A program evaluator provided by the applicant should have training and experience in program evaluation.
- 4. Could I write a vehicle into one of the years grant funding?
 - a. A vehicle would create an asset of more than \$2,500 for the organization and doing so is prohibited within the Funding Limitations section of the RFP.
- 5. How can I find more information on the types of programs that would be eligible for funding?
 - a. The Purpose, the Overview, and Program Purposes sections of the RFP provide information that should be helpful to you in determining whether the program you described is a good fit for the TSET Discovery Grants opportunity.
