# TSET'S MISSION: TO REDUCE PREVENTABLE DEATH IN OKLAHOMA



**TSET INVESTS IN:**

- Tobacco Cessation
- Physical Activity
- Improving Nutrition

## IN OKLAHOMA:

**OBESITY COSTS \$1.72 BILLION**  
IN MEDICAL EXPENDITURES EACH YEAR

- 1 IN 6 HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS IS OBESE
- 1 IN 6 HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS IS OVERWEIGHT
- 1 IN 3 ADULTS IS OBESE

**SMOKING COSTS \$1.88 BILLION**  
IN DIRECT HEALTH CARE COSTS EACH YEAR

- 7,500 ADULT DEATHS EACH YEAR
- 8,400 KIDS (UNDER 18) TRY CIGARETTES FOR THE FIRST TIME EACH YEAR
- \$149 MILLION IS SPENT BY THE TOBACCO INDUSTRY ANNUALLY TO MARKET TOBACCO IN OKLAHOMA
