Welcome to the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs Business Management Program (OKVetWorks)! This is a brand new program for the ODVA and what a better time to start than the month of Veterans Day!

This is a one of a kind state ran program. It combines state and federal resources into a one stop shop. It is designed to assist Veteran owned businesses throughout the state grow in the areas of entrepreneurship, state and federal contracting, working with the Small Business Administration, and much more.

I found it interesting to know that there are only 120 Oklahoma Veteran owned business registered with the Federal Veterans Affairs. There are only 6 registered to bid on state contracts. Only around 10 are able to provide for GSA (federal) contracts.

We work with the state and local chambers to bring attention to these businesses along helping the Veteran owned businesses in educating them in areas of growth. We conduct training, both in person and virtually. We will be conducting regional seminars and resource events. We help direct them in the right direction for small business loans. We will help them in how to market their business and how to bid on state contracts. We will help show them the way to get registered and utilized the benefits it brings along with the registration.

Our Veterans have worked hard and suffer long. They deserve the opportunity to be successful in their businesses and live their dream of working for themselves. Together, we can make a difference – build better, stronger businesses and support our Veterans!

CELEBRATING VETERANS DAY 2020



Veterans Day (originally known as Armistice Day) is a federal holiday in the United States observed annually on November 11, for honoring military veterans, that is, persons who have served in the United States Armed Forces (and were discharged under conditions other than dishonorable). It coincides with other holidays including Armistice Day and Remembrance Day which are celebrated in other countries that mark the anniversary of the end of World War I. Major hostilities of World War I were formally ended at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918, when the Armistice with Germany went into effect. At the urging of major U.S. veteran organizations, Armistice Day was renamed Veterans Day in 1954.
