Overview

These Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) provide guidance on the different endorsements and restrictions specific to Commercial Driver Licenses (CDL) and Commercial Learner Permits (CLP).

Purpose

This SOP includes eligibility requirements for CDL endorsements and restrictions, in addition to instructions on how to apply endorsements and restrictions in the D360 system.

Policy Statement

These procedures only apply to those who are applying for or already hold a CDL or CLP.


Endorsements

Endorsement	Definition	Requirements
T – Double and Triple Trailers	Required to pull double or triple trailers.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> NOT allowed on a CLP Must pass written test Class A only
N – Tank Vehicle	Required to operate any commercial motor vehicle that is designed to transport any liquid or gaseous materials within a tank or tanks having an individual rated capacity of more than 119 gallons and an aggregate rated capacity of 1,000 gallons or more that is either permanently or temporarily attached to the vehicle or the chassis. Applies to Class A, B and C (only applicable to Class C if the vehicle is hauling hazardous materials) vehicles.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ALLOWED on CLP (must have X restriction) Must pass written test
P – Passengers	Required to drive a vehicle having a design capacity to carry 16 or more people, including the driver. Applies to applicants who wish to drive a bus in any class (A, B, or C).	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ALLOWED on CLP Must pass written AND drive test in a bus Must have M or N restriction on CLP or CDL ELDT must be completed prior to skills test
H – Hazardous Materials (Hazmat)	Required to haul any material that has been designated as hazardous under 49 U.S.C. 5103 and is required to be placarded under subpart F of 49 CFR part 172; or any quantity of a material listed as a select agent or toxin 42 CFR Part 73 must add a hazardous materials endorsement to their CDL.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> NOT allowed on a CLP Must pass written test Must have completed hazmat ELDT prior to written test (ELDT can be waived with proof of previously holding hazmat endorsement) Must be at least 21 years of age Must complete TSA background check and provide current TSA information during issuance Only 4-year credentials can be issued with "H" or "X" endorsements Hazmat CANNOT be transferred

X – Combination Hazmat and Tank Vehicle	Required to drive tank vehicles hauling hazardous materials or waste in amounts requiring placards.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> NOT allowed on a CLP Must pass written tests for BOTH hazmat and tank vehicle Hazmat ELDT must be complete prior to written test Hazmat CANNOT be transferred
S – School Bus	Required to drive a school bus. Applies to applicants who wish to drive a school bus in any class (A, B, or C).	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ALLOWED on CLP Must pass written AND drive test in a school bus ELDT must be complete prior to drive test

Hazmat

Before attempting the hazmat written test, applicants must first complete the Entry Level Driver Training (ELDT) for the “H” Endorsement first. Examiners are required to verify that the ELDT is completed on CSTIMS before administering the test.

Those applying for a hazmat endorsement must also pass a background check through the Transportation Security Administration (TSA). It is recommended that applicants complete the background check prior to attempting the written test so that the background check is completed by the time the endorsement is being added.


After the applicant has passed the hazmat written test, they must verify that they passed their TSA background check before their “H” endorsement can be added.

NOTES:

If the TSA information does not support the full 4-year license in Oklahoma, the examiner will build the file as far as possible without actually issuing the credential. Put the transaction on hold and instruct the customer to complete a new TSA background check; once the new check is completed and processed, the customer can return to complete the issuance.

This is because Oklahoma does not have expiring endorsements, so the validity period of the TSA background check must cover the entire duration of the 4-year credential.

Valid To ISSUE

If the TSA information is valid, then the “CD” will appear as “0”. If the status appears as “In Progress”, or the CD is denoted as invalid (“1” or “2”), then the TSA information is invalid and the credential cannot be issued with a hazmat endorsement.

E – No Manual Transmission	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> While operating a Class A or B vehicle, restricted to automatic transmission Must be applied if applicant performed skills test in a vehicle with an automatic transmission
K – Intrastate Only	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> CDL Intrastate only (Cannot leave the state of Oklahoma with CDL vehicles) Required for CDL holders between the ages of 18 and 20 Must be applied if applicant is self-certified as Non-Excepted Intrastate (NA) or Excepted Intrastate (EA)
L – No Air Brake Equipped	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Restricted to CDL vehicles without air brakes Must be applied if applicant performed skills test in a vehicle not equipped with air brakes OR failed air brake component of knowledge test
M – No Class A Passenger Vehicle	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> When operating a passenger bus, restricted to Class B or C vehicle

O – No Tractor Trailer CMV	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Restricted from operating tractor-trailers Must be applied if applicant performed skills test in a combination vehicle for a Class A CDL with the power unit and towed unit connected with a pintle hook or other non-fifth wheel connection
V – Medical Variance	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Medical Variance Must be applied if a medical variance has been issued to the driver on CDLIS

Restriction	Definition
K – Intrastate Only	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Intrastate only (cannot leave the state of Oklahoma with CDL vehicles) Must be applied to all applicants under 21 years of age
L – No Air Brake Equipped	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Restricted to CDL vehicles without air brakes Must be applied if applicant failed air brake component of knowledge test
P – No Passengers in CMV Bus	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Restricted from transporting passengers while on a CDL permit Must be applied to all CLPs with a “P” or “S” endorsement
X – No Cargo in CMV Tank Vehicle	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Restricted from driving a loaded tanker vehicle Must be applied to all CLPs with an “N” endorsement


Processing Endorsements and Restrictions

Once the applicant has passed the required tests (and any additional requirements) and has had their results recorded on their DL-18 form, endorsements and restrictions can be added during the CDL issuance through the “End/Rest” tab.

NOTE: Since Passengers (P) and School Bus (S) endorsements require passing a drive test, applicants must first pass the corresponding written tests to be issued a CLP with the P or S endorsement. They must hold the CLP for 14 full calendar days (not counting the day of issuance) before taking the CDL drive test for that endorsement.

Steps

1. Open D360 and complete the transaction as per usual, up to the “End/Rest” tab.
2. On the “End/Rest” tab, check the boxes under “Endorsements” and “Restrictions” accordingly.




Verify that the endorsements and restrictions are applied correctly.

3. After applying and reviewing the endorsements and restrictions, proceed to the “Checks” tab. Review the checks, then proceed to “Tests”.

4. On the “Tests” tab, double-click on each CDL written/drive test required for the applicant’s new endorsement(s) to enter the results.

Appendix

Appendix A: OAC 670:15-7-2 – Driving restriction codes

(a) A restriction or restrictions may be placed upon a person's driving privilege as deemed necessary by Service Oklahoma, in conjunction with the Department of Public Safety [47 O.S. §6-113]. The restriction(s) will appear as a code on the person's driver license. Following are the various driving restriction codes and their meanings:

- (1) 1. Corrective lenses
- (2) 2. Left outside rearview mirror
- (3) 3. Restriction 1 or 2
- (4) 4. Automatic transmission
- (5) 5. Turn indicators, power steering, or steering knob
- (6) 6. Food, fruit, or candy within reach of driver
- (7) 7. Adequate artificial limbs
- (8) 8. Detailed restriction - Inquire Oklahoma driver license file (This restriction code is used when other restrictions are not applicable. A narrative explaining the restriction will appear on the person's driver license file.)
- (9) 9. May operate a class D motor vehicle only while accompanied by a licensed driver who is at least twenty-one (21) years of age and who is actually occupying a seat beside the permittee between the hours of 5:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m.
- (10) 0. Motorcycle only - When operating a motorcycle under the age 16, restricted to 300cc motorcycle or motor scooter between the hours of 4:30 a.m. and 9:00 p.m.
- (11) A. Regardless of age, when operating a motorcycle must be in view of a person who is licensed to operate a motorcycle or motor-driven cycle and who is at least 21 years old
- (12) E. When operating a commercial motor vehicle, restricted to automatic transmission
- (13) G. Inquire of Oklahoma driver license file until age 17 or older
- (14) J. Farm Permit
- (15) K. CDL intrastate only
- (16) L. When operating a commercial motor vehicle, restricted to a vehicle without air brakes
- (17) M. When operating a passenger bus, restricted to Class B or C commercial motor vehicle
- (18) N. When operating a passenger bus, restricted to a Class C commercial motor vehicle

- (19) O. Restricted from operating tractor trailer vehicles
- (20) R. Ignition interlock device
- (21) V. Medical variance
- (22) W. No Passengers (P or S) or Empty/Purged Tank Vehicle (N); provided, this restriction shall be used only on a commercial learner.
- (23) Z. When operating a commercial motor vehicle with air brakes, restricted to air over hydraulic
- (24) W. No Passengers (P or S) or Empty/Purged Tank Vehicle (N); provided, this restriction shall be used only on a commercial learner.
- (25) Z. When operating a commercial motor vehicle with air brakes, restricted to air over hydraulic

(b) The following are the restriction codes to be used and displayed on a Driver License designed in the Driver 360 program for modernization of the issuance system and the implementation of Real ID. The following are the restriction codes for the new designed license to be implemented in conjunction with REAL ID.

- (1) 0. Motorcycle only - if under age 16, restricted to 300cc motorcycle or motor scooter between the hours of 4:30 a.m. and 9:00 p.m.
- (2) 2. Exempt from Interlock Device in company vehicle with employer letter.
- (3) 3. Either corrective lenses or left outside mirror.
- (4) 4. Automatic Transmission
- (5) 5. Turn Indicators, Power Steering, Steering Knob, (individuals who do not have the adequate use of both hands).
- (6) 6. Food Fruit or Candy within Reach of the Driver.
- (7) 7. Automatic Transmission or Artificial Limb.
- (8) 8. Detailed restriction - Inquire Oklahoma driver license file (This restriction code is used when other restrictions are not applicable. A narrative explaining the restriction will appear on the person's driver license file.)
- (9) 9. Non Commercial Learners Permit - Accompanied by licensed driver age 21 or older in front seat.
- (10) A. Regardless of age, when operating a motorcycle must be in view of a person who is licensed to operate a motorcycle or motor-driven cycle and who is at least 21 years old
- (11) B. Corrective Lenses.
- (12) C. Custom Equipment
- (13) D. Prosthetic Aid.

- (14) E. Automatic transmission - CMV only.
- (15) F. Left Outside Mirror
- (16) G. Daylight Driving Only.
- (17) H. Scope of employment only.
- (18) K. Intrastate Driving Only - CMV
- (19) L. No air Brake equipped CMV
- (20) M. No Class A passenger vehicle.
- (21) N. No Class A or B passenger vehicle.
- (22) O. No Tractor Trailer - CMV
- (23) P. No Passengers in CMV Bus.
- (24) R. Ignition Interlock Device.
- (25) S. Exempt from Seatbelt
- (26) T. Intermediate.
- (27) U. Speed not to exceed 45 MPH, No Interstate Driving.
- (28) V. Medical Waiver
- (29) X. No cargo in CMV tank vehicle.
- (30) Y. Bioptic Lenses.
- (31) Z. No full airbrake equipped CMV.
