

WHAT is a PRSS?

The Certified **Peer Recovery Support Specialist** fulfills a unique role in the support and recovery from mental illness and substance use disorders. A PRSS is a person in recovery from a mental illness and/or substance use disorder, who has been trained to work with others on his/her individual road to recovery. This training incorporates the PRSS's recovery experience as a means of inspiring hope in those they serve, as well as providing a positive role model to others. A PRSS works in collaboration with the people we serve as well as clinical staff in the best interests of the individual's recovery process. There are many positive roles that a PRSS can fulfill in an organization based on their individual skills, experience, education, and desires. Peer Recovery Support Specialists offer the advantage of lived experience from mental illness and/or substance use. They know the journey to recovery is real and attainable because they have traveled the path.

Minimum Qualifications



Have demonstrated recovery from a mental illness, substance use disorder or both.



Be willing to self-disclose about their own recovery.



Pass an examination and successfully share your recovery story based on standards promulgated by ODMHSAS after completing the training.



Agree to respect and observe the PRSS Code of Ethics which must be signed and mailed with their Application Inventory Form to ODMHSAS before being assigned to a training.



Be employed (within 6 months of certification) by or volunteer with the state, a behavioral service provider or an advocacy agency contracting with the state to provide behavioral health services.



Be at least 18 years of age.

FACTS



Working as a PRSS can be a career, a "foot in the door" to other behavioral health careers, and a supplement to certifications or licensures to those already working in the field.



Salary Ranges from approximately \$25,000 to \$40,000. (ODMHSAS offers a PRSS Career Ladder)



Working as a PRSS can provide a great job outlook and career path.



A variety of Continuing Education opportunities free to Certified PRSS offered by ODMHSAS monthly.



Peer Support is a Medicaid compensable service by those certified as a PRSS by ODMHSAS and working for a qualified provider.
